



## PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION:

**First Reported Name:** Name the individual used at the time of the first arrest. All other names used are referred to as Reported Names.

**First Reported Date of Birth:** Date of birth used at the time of the first arrest. All other dates of birth used are referred to as Reported Dates of Birth.

**SID (State ID Number):** Unique number assigned by the BCA to the record of a specific individual

**Reported Names:** Names reported after the first arrest

**Reported Dates of Birth:** Dates of birth reported after the first arrest

**Sex, Height, Weight, Hair, Eye, Race, Place of Birth:** Identifying characteristics of the individual of the record as reported at the time of arrest

**Scars, Marks, and Tattoos:** As reported at the time of arrest

**Identification Numbers:** May include driver's license numbers, social security number, or other numbers

## ARREST INFORMATION:

An arrest does not imply a conviction. If no court information appears on a record do not assume an arrest results in a conviction.

**Arrest Date:** May be the date the individual was arrested, booked, fingerprinted, appeared in court, or was received by a correctional facility.

**Controlling Agency:** The criminal justice agency controlling the arrest or contributing the arrest information. An "arrest" by a correctional facility indicates receipt of that individual in prison.

**Case Number:** Number assigned by the controlling agency used to track the arrest through the criminal justice system.

**Court File Number:** Number assigned by the court system for tracking court cases.

**Prosecution Action:** Prosecutor's decision to decline to prosecute, dismiss, or divert the case which DOES NOT result in a conviction.

**Conviction Date:** Date of conviction.

**Highest Conviction Level:** Level of the highest conviction within a cycle.

**Statute:** Minnesota statute for which the individual was arrested. This information is provided by law enforcement at the time of arrest or by the prosecutor in court.

**Booking Agency:** The criminal justice agency who completed the booking.

**Arresting Agency:** The agency who made the arrest.

**Offense Date:** Date the offense occurred.

**Offense Level:** Level of a specific offense.

## COURT INFORMATION:

**Court Count:** Indicates the count number(s) of the charge(s) filed against the arrestee. The court counts may not correspond with the arrest counts since charging decisions may have changed after arrest.

**Statute:** Minnesota statute with which the arrestee was charged. The statute(s) may not be the same shown in the arrest section. If the statute is unknown, it will be indicated as unknown.

**Assigned Court:** The court hearing the case.

**Disposition Date:** Date the court action occurred.

**Disposition:** Indicates what action occurred at the court appearance. Below is a partial listing of the most common dispositions:

Convicted- individual found guilty

Dismissed- charge dismissed

Deferred- disposition deferred to a later date

Acquitted- Individual found not guilty

Diversion- prosecutor diverted individual to an alternative program. If individual successfully completes program, the charges will be dismissed. If not, charges will be reinstated for prosecution.

Stay of Adjudication: The court may defer further proceedings on certain charges (drug and non-payment of support) as long as the defendant complies with all conditions of probation. These conditions could include local confinement, fine, etc. If the conditions of probation are successfully completed, the case is dismissed and the person is discharged.

**Sentences:** sanctions imposed by the court for the charge.

**Pronounced Date:** The date the arrestee was sentenced.

**HOLDS:** The individual has been held at other facilities for reasons other than new charges i.e. transports, out of county warrants, etc.
