



Integrated Search Service (ISS) Fact Sheet

Integrated Search Service (ISS) is an online product that allows criminal justice professionals to query records from multiple criminal justice databases at one time.

The gap

Minnesota has many powerful tools to collect data about people as they interact with criminal justice agencies. However, many of the data sources are not connected and must be accessed individually.

The solution

ISS is a single access point where records can be searched using various criteria. It does not replace the original sources; it merely provides a single way to access all of the individual sources so users can more easily find what they need. Currently ISS supports eight source systems that can be searched at the same time with a single click of a button. ISS searches those systems to which each individual user has access.

About ISS

ISS is a product designed to assist criminal justice professionals' ability to effectively locate and retrieve criminal justice information they require.

Information currently available through ISS

- Public MNCIS data for open, closed and archived adult felony and misdemeanor court cases.
- Probation and detention information for juveniles and adults currently or previously in the system via S3.
- Hot Files about people, vehicles, and property via the Minnesota and NCIC Hot Files
- Basic demographics and photo for Minnesota drivers' licenses and state IDs, and the corresponding driving record information when applicable via DVS.
- Criminal History information via CCH.
- Booking and arrest records submitted by Minnesota booking facilities, including descriptive and demographic data about individuals, via MRAP.
- Information about registered Minnesota predatory offenders via POR.
- Incident data including people involved, locations, property and offense information through CIBRS.List item

What's next?

The ISS Product Team worked with law enforcement stakeholders to find out what information law enforcement most often needed from ISS queries. Their findings are being used to build a "Search Person Information" query in which the records returned will be those law enforcement most often needs. Once this enhancement is in place others will be considered.
