

ARMER User Requirements:

Before users can have radios on the ARMER system (as an interop user or full user of the system) they need:

- **An approved plan by their respective Regional Radio Board the SRB OTC and Mn/DOT**
- **They need to have the Radio and Talk group ID counts approved by the SRB OTC.**
- **They need to establish who the system administrator is for the purposes of doing the set up of the radios in the system and developing the radio code plug.**
- **They need to determine who will be doing the required FCC radio frequency checks and adjustments.**
- **They need an agreement with the RRB and MnDOT to by a user on the system (Interop or full participant.)**
- **The radios that are going to be used on the ARMER system need to be from the approved list:**

Before Mn/DOT will give the system key to a radio shop so they can program radios for operation on the ARMER system the following needs to be done:

- **The ARMER user they are planning to program radios for needs to be an approved user with an ARMER agreement in place with their RRB and Mn/DOT.**
- **The radio shop needs to be under contract by this user. This user agency is then responsible to insure that the service shop is aware of and follows all Regional and Statewide Radio Board standards. See ARMER Standard 4.10, see link:**

- **The personnel trained to program the brand of radio they plan to program.**
- **They need to attend an ARMER common practices class with MN/DOT.**
