### **1. Purpose or Objective**

The purpose of this standard is to define the function, purpose, and operation of the S-COML talkgroup.

### **2. Technical Background**

The primary use of the S-COML talkgroup will be between Communication Unit Leaders (COMLs) and/or Communications Technicians (COMTs) to provide radio communications and logistic support for pre-planned or emergency public safety incidents.

### **3. Operational Context**

The S-COML talkgroup is a statewide resource to facilitate communications among COMLs and COMTs during a pre-planned or emergency event. The S-COML talkgroup is not used for regular day-to-day operations.

### **4. Recommended Protocol/Standard**

It is required that all COMLs and COMTs have S-COML talkgroup programmed into their radios.

### **5. Recommended Procedure**

Any user transmitting information to another shall:

- Identify by certification and last name
- Identify talkgroup being used
- Example: "COML Laurence to COML Jacky on S-COML"

### **6. Management**

The Statewide Interoperability Program Manager will be responsible for the management for the S-COML talkgroup. Issues involving the operation and use of the S-COML talkgroup are open for review and resolution by the Interoperability Workgroup.
