Current Situation

Background

Minnesota saw significant precipitation fall throughout portions the state during June and the first weeks of July. Beginning June 11, a high precipitation weather system crossed the state causing localized flooding due to stream, river and lake rises coupled with saturated soils. Koochiching and Rock counties began reporting flooding, but experienced little infrastructure damage early in the period.

On June 19, 2014, Governor Mark Dayton issued Governor's Executive Order 14-11, "Declaring a State of Peacetime Emergency in the State of Minnesota" in 35 Minnesota counties.

On July 9, 2014, Governor Dayton submitted a request for a Presidential Disaster Declaration to the White House.

On July 21, 2014, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the State of Minnesota to supplement state and local recovery efforts in the area affected by severe storms, straight-line winds, flooding, landslides, and mudslides during the period of June 11 to July 11, 2014. This is disaster DR-4182.

On July 31, 2014, 24 counties were added to the Major Disaster Declaration. A copy of the FEMA document granting this amendment is attached.

Situation Report Publishing Guidelines

- **Recovery Phase Situation Reports will be issued each Monday afternoon. Agencies involved in recovery activities are encouraged to submit a weekly agency report, due each Monday by Noon addressing activities conducted in the previous week.**

Operations Section Chief

Agency Summary

- The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) remains at Level IV: Monitoring.
- **Process for Recovery Resource Requests**
 - The MN Duty Officer will take calls from *County Emergency Managers (or their designee)* requesting resources for recovery efforts (651-649-5451 / 800-422-0798).
 - The request will be routed to the SEOC where a corresponding DisasterLAN call ticket can be entered, tracked and actions can be documented.
 - Coordination with the Public/Private Coordination and Action Team (P2CAT), or other appropriate entity, will be handled by SEOC Logistics.
 - Requesters can track request progress by using the DisasterLAN Ticket Manager and searching for the corresponding DLAN call ticket.
- The Readiness Section is working with HSEM Recovery staff to address equipment needs during the upcoming Applicant Briefings.
- The Readiness Section continues maintaining situational awareness for SEOC partners and those involved in the recovery process.

SEOC Recovery Operations

Agency Summary

- On August 13, 2014, FEMA amended major disaster declaration DR-4182 to include 3 additional counties and 1 Tribal government; Lyon, Watonwan, Wright, and Bois Forte Band of Chippewa. Applicant Briefings are continuing in those counties and Tribal Governments which have been designated.
- The counties of Dakota, Hennepin, and Ramsey are still under consideration.



SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The notice of a major disaster declaration for the State of Minnesota is hereby amended to include the following areas among those areas determined to have been adversely affected by the event declared a major disaster by the President in his declaration of July 21, 2014.

Lyon, Watonwan, and Wright Counties and the Bois Forte Band of Chippewa within Koochiching County for Public Assistance.
