# State of Minnesota Multiyear Training and Exercise Plan (TEP)



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### Introduction

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) helps Minnesotans prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from disasters and works to keep Minnesota secure from acts of terrorism. The primary purpose of the program is to build communities that are prepared to respond to emergencies and have the resilience to quickly recover from the effects of disaster.

HSEM receives federal grants to aid in accomplishing its mission. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Preparedness Grants agreements require every state and urban area to conduct an annual Multiyear Training and Exercise Planning Workshop (TEPW). Minnesota conducted its 2015–2017 TEPW on December 4, 2014, and produced this Multiyear Training and Exercise Plan (TEP).

The TEP is HSEM’s training and exercise roadmap for accomplishing its mission and addressing its homeland security strategy priorities. Innovative training and realistic exercises give Minnesota a means to practice and improve its mission-related capabilities. Minnesota’s training and exercise programs are administered by HSEM in coordination with other state, local and tribal emergency response agencies.

The TEP represents a single point in time and is revised annually to reflect changes in national and state priorities, lessons learned from real-world events, new areas of need and changes in grant requirements. HSEM updates the TEP calendar of events quarterly.



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## Overview

An effective TEP relies on a clear understanding of the planning process and its parts. The TEP represents the shared work of emergency management personnel from all levels of government and their partners.

The National Preparedness Goal, released in September 2011, defines what it means for the whole community to be prepared for all types of disasters and emergencies. The goal is succinct:

“...a secure and resilient nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk.”

A closer look at its terms can help increase understanding of what is required for emergency management personnel to meet the National Preparedness Goal.

### Mission Areas

The five mission areas are explained in the National Preparedness Goal as follows:

- **Prevent** — Prevention includes those capabilities necessary to avoid, prevent, or stop a threatened or actual act of terrorism.
- **Protect** — Protection includes capabilities to safeguard the homeland against acts of terrorism and man-made or natural disasters.
- **Mitigate** — Mitigation includes those capabilities necessary to reduce loss of life and property by lessening the impact of disasters.
- **Respond** — Response includes those capabilities necessary to save lives, protect property and the environment, and meet basic human needs after an incident has occurred.
- **Recover** — Recovery includes those capabilities necessary to assist communities affected by an incident in recovering effectively.

Successful completion of the mission areas means we are meeting the goal of national preparedness. The mission areas are achieved through focused activities called Core Capabilities.

### Capabilities Required

The “capabilities required” in the National Preparedness Goal are the 31 Core Capabilities that address the greatest risks to the nation. They define the actions emergency management personnel carry out under each mission area. The Core Capabilities are critical to the process used to create the TEP because of the mission-centered focus they bring to the planning of training and exercises. A full list of the Core Capabilities, including details about each one, is in the [Core Capabilities appendix](#) at the end of this report.

### Whole Community

Preparedness is a shared responsibility; whole community calls for the involvement of everyone—not just the government—in preparedness efforts. Whole community is defined in the National Preparedness Goal:

- Involving people in the development of the preparedness documents.
- Ensuring their roles and responsibilities are reflected in the content of the materials.

In addition to all levels of government (state, local, tribal and federal partners), whole community includes

- Individuals and families, including those with access and functional needs
- Businesses
- Faith-based and community organizations
- Nonprofit groups
- Schools and academia
- Media outlets

### **Threats and Hazards**

Threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk include events such as natural disasters, disease pandemics, chemical spills and other manmade hazards, terrorist attacks and cyber-attacks. In Minnesota, jurisdictions assess hazards and risks by using tools such as the Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA). The THIRA allows a jurisdiction to understand its threats and hazards and how impacts may vary according to time of occurrence, season, location and other community factors. This knowledge helps a jurisdiction establish its goals (or capability targets) for each of the 31 Core Capabilities. These targets aid in planning training and exercise activities.

## Program Priorities

HSEM program priorities reflect those of the National Preparedness Goal. HSEM identified the five primary areas of focus for the current TEP as follows:

- Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) Threats
- Mass Care Services/Mass Casualty Preparedness
- Strengthening Planning/Common Operating Picture
- The Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program
- Community Preparedness

These priorities resulted from analysis of the Minnesota State Preparedness Report, the Minnesota state THIRA, real-world events and reviews of After Action Reports (AARs) and Improvement Plans (IPs).

### **CBRNE**

CBRNE falls under the Protect mission area and is categorized as the Screening, Search and Detection Core Capability: to identify, discover, or locate threats and/or hazards through active and passive surveillance and search procedures. This may include the use of systematic examinations and assessments, sensor technologies, or physical investigation and intelligence.

CBRNE is also related to the Core Capability of On-Scene Security and Protection. This means to ensure a safe and secure environment through law enforcement and related security and protection operations for people and communities located within affected areas. The capability includes traditional and atypical response personnel engaged in lifesaving and life sustaining operations.

In the context of the TEP, training and exercise activities regarding CBRNE examine the protective measures that Screening, Search and Detection encompasses and also view CBRNE in terms of consequence management. Emergency management personnel can work in tandem with the Whole Community to protect against and prepare for the consequences of chemical, biological, nuclear, radiological and explosive threats in order to minimize the impact to responders and the public.

### **Mass Care Services/Mass Casualty Preparedness**

Mass Care Services is part of the Respond mission area and is the fundamental capability to provide life-sustaining services to the affected population with a focus on hydrating, feeding and sheltering those who have the most need. This capability also supports re-unifying families.

Mass Casualty Preparedness refers to a mass casualty incident (MCI): any incident in which the number and severity of casualties overwhelms emergency medical services resources, such as personnel and equipment. One Core Capability associated with Mass Casualty Preparedness is Public Health and Medical Services; it is the capability to provide lifesaving medical treatment via emergency medical services and related operations. The capability also avoids additional disease and injury by providing targeted public health support and medical assistance/products to all people in need within the affected area.

Critical Transportation is another Core Capability essential to Mass Care Services and Mass Casualty Preparedness. Critical Transportation is the ability to provide transportation (including infrastructure

access and accessible transportation services) for response priority objectives, including the evacuation of people and animals, and the delivery of vital response personnel, equipment and services into the affected areas.

In the context of the TEP, training and exercise activities focus on the basic goals of mass care and MCIs, always inclusive of individuals with access and functional needs and others considered at-risk. These goals include the following:

- The capability to, in a timely manner, move and deliver resources to meet the needs of disaster survivors, establish emergency shelters and other temporary housing options, and aid with housing solutions for families unable to return to their homes.
- Establish, staff and equip emergency shelters and other temporary housing options (including accessible housing) for the affected population.
- Establish physical access through appropriate transportation corridors and deliver required resources to save lives and meet the needs of disaster survivors.
- Ensure basic human needs are met, stabilize the incident, transition into recovery for an affected area and restore basic services and community functionality.
- Deliver medical countermeasures to exposed populations.
- Complete triage and initial stabilization of casualties and begin definitive care for those likely to survive their injuries.
- Return medical surge resources to pre-incident levels, complete health assessments and identify recovery processes.

### **Strengthening Planning/Common Operating Picture**

Strengthening Planning/Common Operating Picture is most closely associated with three Core Capabilities: Planning, Operational Communication and Operational Coordination. These capabilities span all five mission areas and intersect with many other capabilities.

When defined as a Core Capability, Planning is a systematic process that engages the whole community as appropriate in the development of strategic, operational and/or community-based approaches to meet defined objectives for emergency management.

In the context of the TEP, training and exercise activities focus on providing stronger planning efforts by including the whole community in planning efforts across all mission areas. This means partners from the private sector, at-risk populations, partner agencies, non-governmental organizations, volunteer groups and others are an integrated part of training and exercise topics and activities throughout the three-year calendar.

A common operating picture is established and maintained by collecting information from all appropriate parties involved in an incident, then organizing, integrating and disseminating that information so all responding entities have the same situational awareness of incident status and information when conducting operations.

When emergency management personnel have the same information about the incident (including the availability and location of resources, personnel and the status of requests for assistance), it enables them to make effective, consistent and timely decisions.

In the context of the TEP, training and exercise activities focus on those components of emergency management that foster a common operating picture. National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant training offers a unified approach to handling situations requiring the cooperation of multiple disciplines, agencies and jurisdictions.

### **The Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program**

The Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP) provides law enforcement communities with enhanced capabilities for detecting, deterring, disrupting and preventing acts of terrorism. LETPP focuses on providing resources to law enforcement and public safety communities (working with their private partners) to support critical terrorism prevention activities such as establishing/enhancing fusion centers and collaborating with non-law enforcement partners, other government agencies and the private sector.

The Core Capabilities most closely aligned to the LETPP fall under the mission areas of Prevention, Protection and Response, and include Planning, Operational Coordination, Forensics and Attribution, Intelligence and Information Sharing, Interdiction and Disruption, Screening Search and Detection, Physical Protective Measures, Access Control and Identity Verification, and On-Scene Security and Protection.

In the context of the TEP, training and exercise activities focus on those components and activities of emergency management that interact and coordinate with law enforcement's terrorism prevention-oriented planning, organization and equipment, including activities that support the development and operation of fusion centers.

### **Community Preparedness**

Under the mission area of Mitigation, the Core Capabilities of Community Resilience and Long-term Vulnerability Reduction describe the activities that promote community preparedness for all hazards. Emergency management personnel must lead the integrated effort to recognize, understand, communicate, plan and address risks so the community can develop a set of actions to accomplish mitigation and improve resilience.

Long-term Vulnerability Reduction means to build and sustain resilient systems and communities, as well as critical infrastructure and key resource (CIKR) lifelines, to reduce their vulnerability to all hazards incidents. These efforts can lessen the likelihood, severity and duration of adverse consequences related to all hazards incidents, meaning things get back to normal more quickly after an incident.

In the context of the TEP, training and exercise activities focus on mitigation efforts that involve the Whole Community to ensure that information gathered and plans formulated for community preparedness are comprehensive and coordinated to the jurisdiction's risk analysis.

## Methodology

Each jurisdiction and state agency has independently chosen appropriate coursework and exercises for its personnel. HSEM recommends use of the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) methodology, while recognizing that other methodologies exist and are also useful to exercise planning and execution.

Ideally, the methodology chosen can

- Challenge participants with increasingly advanced courses and exercise scenarios
- Include, strengthen and confirm lessons learned
- Identify a jurisdiction's capability strengths and those in need of improvement
- Provide a means of evaluation and corrective action for exercises
- Ensure a method to share lessons learned and best practices from training courses and exercises

The HSEEP method of planning, training, exercising and evaluating can provide each stakeholder with the ability to document improvement in After Action Reports (AARs) and Improvement Plans (IPs) following exercises or real-world events.

HSEEP methodology can help jurisdictions meet the intent of grant funding by providing a progressive planning approach that includes all the critical elements needed to effectively exercise and evaluate capabilities. HSEEP's uniform methodology offers a detailed approach that takes the guesswork out of the planning process. The HSEM Website has [exercise resources](#) to help emergency management personnel develop exercises, from the initial planning meetings to AAR/IP writing.

A cycle, mix and range of training courses and exercises can help a jurisdiction increase its preparedness. The ongoing preparedness cycle, including different and progressively more difficult training courses and exercise activities, helps develop a solid homeland security and emergency management program. Online HSEEP systems, including the HSEEP Toolkit and National Exercise Schedule (NEXS) have been undergoing improvements and revisions since August 2013. HSEM will review the changes to these systems with emergency management personnel statewide as more information becomes available.

## Scheduling and Tracking

Jurisdictions and state agencies report training activities and exercises via the HSEM training and exercise planning form (TEP E-Z). The TEP E-Z form gathers critical event information in one place. These events are added to the state schedule contained in this document and on the HSEM Website. The schedule is reviewed and updated quarterly at regional meetings. Training or exercise activities to be entered into the schedule include:

- Those that are multi-disciplinary
- Those that are multi-jurisdictional
- Those for which federal grant funding is used

## Data Reporting and Review

Each jurisdiction documents coursework completed and exercise outcomes. HSEM reviews the reports and submits aggregate data to FEMA quarterly. The recommended format for exercise outcomes is the AAR/IP form template, which is available on the [HSEM Exercise Resources webpage](#).

Jurisdictions submit AAR/IPs within 90 days of an exercise, in accordance with grant requirements. AAR/IPs are to be sent to the HSEEP INBOX, the jurisdiction's or agency's regional program coordinator and the HSEM exercise officer.

AAR/IPs collected from exercises provide a broad picture of the efforts and progress made toward reaching each jurisdiction's goals and are critical to assessing Minnesota's capabilities and preparedness in regard to the mission areas previously mentioned. This data, when added to the data from other states in FEMA Region 5 and across the nation, gives FEMA a firm grasp of national capabilities.

### Workshop Welcome and Overview

Thirty state agency, regional, county and tribal participants attended the 2015-2017 TEPW. State Administrative Agency Training Point of Contact Lois Anderson and former Exercise Officer Jennifer Lindberg acted as co-facilitators. Integrated Emergency Management Course Coordinator Glenn Elvecrog assisted. To provide more energy and facilitate discussion, the audience response system was used to pose questions.

## Appendix E: Core Capabilities Definitions

### Planning

- Mission Areas: All
- Description: Conduct a systematic process engaging the whole community as appropriate in the development of executable strategic, operational, and/or community-based approaches to meet defined objectives.

### Public Information and Warning

- Mission Areas: All
- Description: Deliver coordinated, prompt, reliable, and actionable information to the whole community through the use of clear, consistent, accessible, and culturally and linguistically appropriate methods to effectively relay information regarding any threat or hazard, as well as the actions being taken and the assistance being made available, as appropriate.

### Operational Coordination

- Mission Areas: All
- Description: Establish and maintain a unified and coordinated operational structure and process that appropriately integrates all critical stakeholders and supports the execution of core capabilities.

### Forensics and Attribution

- Mission Area: Prevention
- Description: Conduct forensic analysis and attribute terrorist acts (including the means and methods of terrorism) to their source, to include forensic analysis as well as attribution for an attack and for the preparation for an attack in an effort to prevent initial or follow-on acts and/or swiftly develop counter-options

### Intelligence and Information Sharing

- Mission Areas: Prevention, Protection
- Description: Provide timely, accurate, and actionable information resulting from the planning, direction, collection, exploitation, processing, analysis, production, dissemination, evaluation, and feedback of available information concerning threats to the United States, its people, property, or interests; the development, proliferation, or use of WMDs; or any other matter bearing on U.S.



national or homeland security by Federal, state, local, and other stakeholders. Information sharing is the ability to exchange intelligence, information, data, or knowledge among Federal, state, local, or private sector entities, as appropriate.

### **Interdiction and Disruption**

- Mission Areas: Prevention, Protection
- Description: Delay, divert, intercept, halt, apprehend, or secure threats and/or hazards.

### **Screening, Search, and Detection**

- Mission Areas: Prevention, Protection
- Description: Identify, discover, or locate threats and/or hazards through active and passive surveillance and search procedures. This may include the use of systematic examinations and assessments, sensor technologies, or physical investigation and intelligence.

### **Access Control and Identity Verification**

- Mission Area: Protection
- Description: Apply a broad range of physical, technological, and cyber measures to control admittance to critical locations and systems, limiting access to authorized individuals to carry out legitimate activities.

### **Cybersecurity**

- Mission Area: Protection
- Description: Protect against damage to, the unauthorized use of, and/or the exploitation of (and, if needed, the restoration of) electronic communications systems and services (and the information contained therein).

### **Physical Protective Measures**

- Mission Area: Protection
- Description: Reduce or mitigate risks, including actions targeted at threats, vulnerabilities, and/or consequences, by controlling movement and protecting borders, critical infrastructure, and the homeland.

### **Risk Management for Protection Programs and Activities**

- Mission Area: Protection
- Description: Identify, assess, and prioritize risks to inform Protection activities and investments

### **Supply Chain Integrity and Security**

- Mission Area: Protection
- Description: Strengthen the security and resilience of the supply chain.

### **Community Resilience**

- Mission Area: Mitigation
- Description: Lead the integrated effort to recognize, understand, communicate, plan, and address risks so that the community can develop a set of actions to accomplish Mitigation and improve resilience.

### **Long-term Vulnerability Reduction**

- Mission Area: Mitigation
- Description: Build and sustain resilient systems, communities, and critical infrastructure and key resources lifelines so as to reduce their vulnerability to natural, technological, and human-caused incidents by lessening the likelihood, severity, and duration of the adverse consequences related to these incidents.

### **Risk and Disaster Resilience Assessment**

- Mission Area: Mitigation
- Description: Assess risk and disaster resilience so that decision makers, responders, and community members can take informed action to reduce their entity's risk and increase their resilience.

### **Threats and Hazard Identification**

- Mission Area: Mitigation
- Description: Identify the threats and hazards that occur in the geographic area; determine the frequency and magnitude; and incorporate this into analysis and planning processes so as to clearly understand the needs of a community or entity.



### **Critical Transportation**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Provide transportation (including infrastructure access and accessible transportation services) for response priority objectives, including the evacuation of people and animals, and the delivery of vital response personnel, equipment, and services into the affected areas.

### **Environmental Response/Health and Safety**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Ensure the availability of guidance and resources to address all hazards including hazardous materials, acts of terrorism, and natural disasters in support of the responder operations and the affected communities.

### **Fatality Management Services**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Provide fatality management services, including body recovery and victim identification, working with state and local authorities to provide temporary mortuary solutions, sharing information with mass care services for the purpose of reunifying family members and caregivers with missing persons/remains, and providing counseling to the bereaved.

### **Infrastructure Systems**

- Mission Area: Response, Recovery
- Description: Stabilize critical infrastructure functions, minimize health and safety threats, and efficiently restore and revitalize systems and services to support a viable, resilient community.

### **Mass Care Services**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Provide life-sustaining services to the affected population with a focus on hydration, feeding, and sheltering to those who have the most need, as well as support for reunifying families.



## **Mass Search and Rescue Operations**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Deliver traditional and atypical search and rescue capabilities, including personnel, services, animals, and assets to survivors in need, with the goal of saving the greatest number of endangered lives in the shortest time possible.

## **On-scene Security and Protection**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Ensure a safe and secure environment through law enforcement and related security and protection operations for people and communities located within affected areas and also for all traditional and atypical response personnel engaged in lifesaving and life-sustaining operations.

## **Operational Communications**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Ensure the capacity for timely communications in support of security, situational awareness, and operations by any and all means available, among and between affected communities in the impact area and all response forces.

## **Public and Private Services and Resources**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Provide essential public and private services and resources to the affected population and surrounding communities, to include emergency power to critical facilities, fuel support for emergency responders, and access to community staples (e.g., grocery stores, pharmacies, and banks) and fire and other first response services.

## **Public Health and Medical Services**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Provide lifesaving medical treatment via emergency medical services and related operations and avoid additional disease and injury by providing targeted public health and medical support and products to all people in need within the affected area.

## **Situational Assessment**

- Mission Area: Response
- Description: Provide all decision makers with decision-relevant information regarding the nature and extent of the hazard, any cascading effects, and the status of the response.

## **Economic Recovery**

- Mission Area: Recovery
- Description: Return economic and business activities (including food and agriculture) to a healthy state and develop new business and employment opportunities that result in a sustainable and economically viable community.

## **Health and Social Services**

- Mission Area: Recovery
- Description: Restore and improve health and social services networks to promote the resilience, independence, health (including behavioral health), and well-being of the whole community.

## **Housing**

- Mission Area: Recovery
- Description: Implement housing solutions that effectively support the needs of the whole community and contribute to its sustainability and resilience.

## **Natural and Cultural Resources**

- Mission Area: Recovery
- Description: Protect natural and cultural resources and historic properties through appropriate planning, mitigation, response, and recovery actions to preserve, conserve, rehabilitate, and restore them consistent with post-disaster community priorities and best practices and in compliance with appropriate environmental and historical preservation laws and executive orders.
