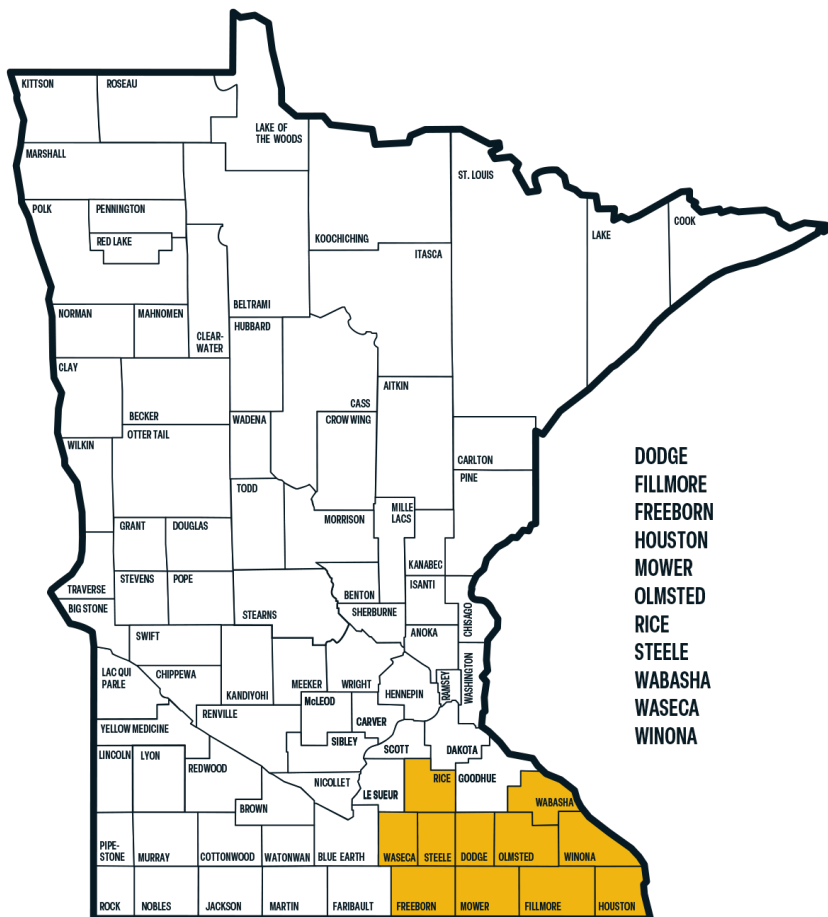
2021 Stats

Programs in Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Houston, Mower, Olmsted, Rice, Steele, Wabasha, Waseca and Winona counties received \$6.2 million in total funding — Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) and state — that helped provide services to 14,246 victims.

- Domestic violence victims – 6,083
- General crime victims – 4,904
- 2 emergency domestic violence shelters provided:
 - Shelter bed nights: 6,303 women and 6,945 children
- Sexual assault victims – 1,650
- Supervised visitation for children – 780
- Child advocacy center – 232
- Abused children – 137
