Byrne Justice Assistance Grants (JAG) 2018-2020

Overview: The U.S. Department of Justice provides JAG fund to prevent and control crime and improve the functioning of the criminal and juvenile justice systems.

The Minnesota JAG Recidivism Reduction grants seek to improve public safety by strengthening collaborative efforts between criminal justice and social services to better serve youth and adults as they return to communities from correctional placements. The intent of this funding is to enhance access to services, supports and resources needed for offenders to succeed in the community.
