I have knowledge of the Anishinaabe worldview and utilize my lived experience in helping those in need. I am currently working on my Indigenous Leadership degree at Leech Lake Tribal College.

I sit on Violence Free Minnesota's Board of Directors and the Northwoods Battered Women's Shelter, which helps me understand the broader aspects of domestic violence and sexual violence. I am also a member of the MMIR office Advisory Council and MNCASA.
