



## Did you know?

Gas meters that ice up regularly are typically below a roof's drip line.

Using a snow blower near a gas meter can be dangerous.

You should call your utility company if you are concerned that your meter's regulator vent may be blocked or not functioning properly.

## GAS METER SAFETY

- Natural gas meters outside your home need to be clear of snow and ice.
- Ice or snow can block the meter's regulator vent and cause a malfunction.
- A meter malfunction could lead to a possible gas leak, fire or explosion, or an interruption in service.
- The best way to clear the snow and ice from your meter is with your hand or a small broom.
