



## Minnesota Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Practitioner Guideline

A CPS practitioner is in place to assist current Nationally Certified Technicians with the large demand for CPS education and demonstration of correct use and installation of car seats.

### Requirements

- Successfully complete the Minnesota approved CPS Practitioner course. \*
  - Complete child passenger safety update course each year thereafter. \*\*
- Work under the supervision/direction of a certified technician/ instructor.
- Document child passenger safety activities.
- Participate in one (1) community event per year.

### Qualifications

- Ability to provide exceptional customer service.
- Ability to adjust teaching style based on the participants needs.
- The desire to assist others in providing CPS education/demonstration to caregivers across Minnesota.
- Commitment to keep up to date on CPS best practices.
- Ability to admit when you do not know the answer.

### Capabilities

- Provide CPS awareness education and hands demonstration of CPS technical skills including but not limited to; car seat check-up events, appointments, community events and presentations.

\*Initial certification course will use materials developed by the Minnesota Child Passenger Safety Program (MCPSP).

\*\*yearly training agenda will submitted to MN CPS coordinator for approval.

*The State of Minnesota encourages individuals to pursue National certification. Becoming a certified technician provides the ability to work independently, become a proxy or an instructor and further the reach of Child Passenger Safety.*
