



Technician Guideline

All training workshops in Minnesota will use the same participant manuals and instructor kits. Practitioner workshops will use the materials developed by the Minnesota Child Passenger Safety Program (MCPSP). Technician and Technician-Instructor training workshops will use the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's Standard Curriculum (NHTSA).

All training courses must be approved by the MCPSP.

Requirements:

- Successfully complete the 32-hour NHTSA-approved CPS training.
- Keep a current National CPS Technician Certification with Safe Kids Worldwide
- Provide MCPSP with activity report quarterly which includes appoints and all Check Up events in Minnesota

Capabilities:

- Provide one-on-one CPS awareness education to families.
- Operate a child safety seat distribution program.
- Provide presentations on child passenger safety.
- Perform safety seat checks/inspections on one-on-one basis (i.e., in-home/in-office).
- Perform safety seat checks/inspections at Check Up events.
- May be an instructor of the sixteen-hour MCPSP / per application process
- May be an instructor of the eight-hour MCPSP/ per application process
- May be an instructor of the three-hour MCPSP / per application process
