ALLEGED MISCONDUCT FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2020 – Statewide

Minn. Stat. 626.8457, subd. 3, requires Chief Law Enforcement Officers (CLEOs) to annually report summary data regarding the investigation and disposition of cases involving alleged unprofessional conduct by peace officers based on your department’s allegations of misconduct policy (Minn. R. 6700.2200). Your department’s policy should minimally require the complainant to complete and sign a citizen complaint form for the complaint to be considered filed. The policy should also allow the CLEO the discretion to determine whether or not the facts alleged require a formal investigation.

Failure to disclose or providing false information may result in disciplinary action against the CLEO’s license.
