

Chapter 171 of Minnesota Statutes, provides the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Public Safety (DPS), through its Driver and Vehicle Services Division (DVS), authority to regulate the licensure and driving privilege of individuals who operate vehicles, including motorcycles, on Minnesota roads. In this rulemaking proceeding, DPS proposes to promulgate a new rule chapter governing the administrative, safety and equipment, and program curriculum requirements and certification qualifications for the Motorcycle Road Guard Program (MRGP).

Minnesota Statutes, section 171.60, subdivision 5, 3, sections 27 and 43, authorize the Commissioner of Public Safety to adopt rules to govern the Motorcycle Road Guard Program, as provided by including the certification and qualifications requirement proposed in a new chapter. ¹

Motorcycle crash data for 2012, compiled by DPS, shows a 31% increase in motorcycle fatalities over 2011.² Public safety issues rise as the number of fatalities and motorcyclist's increases. DPS reported "over 230,000 registered motorcycles and more than 400,000 licensed operators.³ Alcohol use, accident severity, helmet use and operator training are all critical factors in examining issues and trends related to motorcycle driver and passenger safety. In Minnesota, there were 55 motorcycle-related deaths reported during 2012.

The Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) Division of DPS works to reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries caused by traffic accidents. OTS administers federal and state funding to support programs that "encourage responsible driving behavior, enforce traffic laws, and [to] inform and educate the public."

The Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Program is part of the OTS division and is authorized to operate the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center (MMSC). The MMSC works to prevent motorcycle crashes, fatalities and injuries by providing high-quality rider education, training and licensing.

Ensuring the safety of Minnesota motorcyclists, including those riders and their passengers who engage in group ride activities, for sport, charity, and recreational purposes will be greatly enhanced through the development of training curriculum for motorcycle road guard instructors, and certificate holders. Classroom and on-cycle training is supplemented by the media events, informational materials, rider course promotion, and outreach. The curriculum for the Motorcycle Road Guard Certificate Program will follow the outline proposed in Chapter 7422.

Minnesota Statutes, section 14.116, states:

"14.116 NOTICE TO LEGISLATURE.

When an agency mails notice of intent to adopt rules under section 14.14 or 14.22, the agency must send a copy of the same notice and a copy of the statement of need and reasonableness to the chairs and ranking minority party members of the legislative policy and budget committees with jurisdiction over the subject matter of the proposed rules and to the Legislative Coordinating Commission.

In addition, if the mailing of the notice is within two years of the effective date of the law granting the agency authority to adopt the proposed rules, the agency shall make reasonable efforts to send a copy of the notice and the statement to all sitting legislators who were chief house and senate authors of the bill granting the rulemaking authority.

If the bill was amended to include this rulemaking authority, the agency shall make reasonable efforts to send the notice and the statement to the chief house and senate authors of the amendment granting rulemaking authority, rather than to the chief authors of the bill."
